Abstract

Lockdowns and policy measures to curtail the impact of COVID-19 have had widespread repercussions in the sphere of economy, society and health systems. The Indian health system may have put the best of its efforts to cope up with the burden of the pandemic, but the gap between needs and capacity has had its impact on livelihoods in rural areas. Existing public health measures were hampered as available resources were focused to deal with COVID19-related tasks in rural areas. Contours of local livelihoods have undergone changes and the disruptions in income patterns have further affected rural lives. This lecture presents preliminary observations on the status of institutional health systems and the challenges for rural livelihoods and changes in income patterns through observation of ground realities.
